



BPSHS Assessment Policy - AI

Academic integrity- AI must not substitute original thinking and AI use by student in assessment must not compromise the authenticity and integrity of their work

Each faculty is responsible for determining if and how generative AI may be used in subject assessments adhering to QCAA/ACARA guidelines

If AI use is permitted for a task, it must be clearly acknowledged and referenced.
All submitted work must reflect the student's own thinking and understanding.

Select the appropriate level that students can use AI to assist when completing the assessment and add to the cover page of all assessments for all year levels. Refer to the school assessment guide – pgs 15 - 16 for further information and examples regarding AI in assessment.

If AI misuse is suspected, students may be required to verify their work and remove any AI-generated or unoriginal content.

A student will be graded only on work they can verify as their own.
