Student Council Report by SRC President, Ishanne Ma-Low and SRC Vice President, Hannah Makings:	<p>Good afternoon Bray Park High School's P & C, on behalf of the Student Council we would like to give our sincere apologies for our absence at today's meeting. Recently, the student council has hosted numerous events for our school as well as providing funding for the new and improved flagpoles at the front of the school. This is a brilliant addition to our school and showcases our pride here at Bray Park State High School. We are very happy with the results of the new flagpoles and very thankful to Mr. Turner for his contribution towards the project. Our fundraising committee has recently raised \$495 for Mr Dawes' project to provide stationery items for students lacking school supplies. Mr Dawes is collaborating with the fundraising committee to purchase these items and provide supplies for students in need by term 3. Our social committee recently hosted the Year 8 and 9 social which gained us \$838, increasing the Student Council Budget to \$8,025. The social was a very successful night, and the committee received a vast amount of positive feedback from the Junior school. The next social event is the Senior school State of Origin night in term 3, week 1. This event has been a success in the past and the committee is looking forward to hosting it again. Our environment committee has exceeded expectations this year has transformed Bray Park into an eco-friendly environment. The committee has collaborated with the Tangalooma Eco-marines' group to advocate for the reduction of litter within the school grounds. Recently, there has been a major improvement with rubbish, thanks to the environmental committee. The student welfare committee are aiming to keep student's and teacher morals up this term. The inclusion of a new buddy system for misbehaved junior students is aimed to improve the behavior of the students by assigning them a senior buddy for a break once a week. We will be trialing meditation within classes for the year 7 and 8's, to investigate if this helps students calm down before class and improve the overall classroom environment. The student council aims to improve facilities for students in term 3, including improved toilets and an eftspos machine for school social and events.
